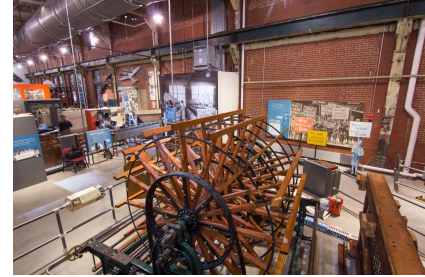


The American Silk Story
