

## Williams Township Historic Cemeteries Driving Tour for Passport to History

July 15, 2023

12 noon to 4 pm

Start at Raubsville Cemetery, 205 Royal Manor Rd., Easton (Williams Township), PA

Pick up printed driving guide with maps and vignettes of Raubsville, Old Williams/St. Luke's Lutheran, Hays, St. John's Union (uniting Lutheran and former UCC churches), and Blue Church cemeteries.

Mentioned will be three Catholic Church cemeteries (St. Anthony's, St. Joseph's. and Mary Magdalen) created on open township land in the 1900s, and family-farm cemeteries that once dotted the landscape (Stouts, Schumacher, and Heinlines/Hineline), and an early Methodist church.

Raubsville Cemetery is located at 205 Royal Manor Road.</li><li>3. St John's Union Cemetery is located around the St John's Lutheran Church at 2745 Morgan Hill Road.</li><li>4. Christ United Evangelical Cemetery is located behind the "Blue Church" at 2100 Morgan Hill Road.</li><li>5. St Anthony's Cemetery is located at 520 Cedarville Road.</li><li>6. Saint Mary Magdalen Cemetery is located at the southern end of St John Street in South Easton, just across the Line Street border between Easton and Williams Township.</li><li>7. St Joseph's Cemetery is located at the end of Davis Street, south of Williams Street, just over the line in Williams Township from Easton.</li><li>8.
